


>> INTEGRATIVE MEDICINE FOR NEUROCOGNITION AND DEMENTIA



AUSTRALIA'S NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF COMPLEMENTARY MEDICINE AT WESTERN SYDNEY UNIVERSITY WILL HOST A SYMPOSIUM ON INTEGRATIVE MEDICINE FOR NEUROCOGNITION AND DEMENTIA ON TUESDAY, 1 DECEMBER 2015.

Dementia is the single greatest cause of disability in Australians aged 65 years and older, and is the third leading cause of death in Australia (the second leading cause in women). Accelerating research and innovation in the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and management of this health area is a national and global priority.

Bringing together leading researchers, clinicians and industry groups from Australia and China, the symposium will discuss key issues relating to integrative medicine research and integrative care for dementia and cognitive problems, and related mental health issues; and help develop the agenda for future priority research in this field.
